Thank you to the parents and teachers who attended the future focused workshop with Tracey Ezard last week. Parents brainstormed the skills that they used during their day and then explored the skills that they want their children to develop for the future.

We started a valuable conversation about the role of school in developing the core skills of literacy and numeracy along with curiosity, problem solving and collaboration to name a few. At Ivanhoe East Primary School we implement evidence based learning programs and are continually striving to improve our teaching practices to engage our students in rich learning experiences that develop these key skills. Our teachers work in collaborative teams to identify the needs and interests of students. This helps them plan targeted lessons that teach students key literacy and numeracy skills and provide opportunities for students to apply these skills in project work and investigations.

Tracey will return to IEPS in 2017 so that we can continue the conversation and imagine the future of learning together. In the meantime, our dedicated staff will continue to plan together and focus on providing a rich learning program for all of our students.

2017 Planning



Teachers are working through the class placement process and we are finalising staffing arrangements for 2017. Some new staff will be joining us in 2017 and we are working through a process to develop teams with a broad range of experiences, skills and expertise. The school's organisational structure for 2017 is designed to support teachers as they work together to identify the learning needs of students and implement a rigorous learning program.

In 2017, there will be a part time Learning Enhancement Teacher in each teaching team (Prep, Year 1-2, Year 3-4, Year 5-6) who will work with the team to use learning data to guide targeted intervention for our students. There will be a Teaching Assistant in each team who will provide administrative support and work with small groups of students. All of our new staff will be provided with an extensive induction program before the start of the 2017 school year.
