MUFFIN MONDAY

On Monday the Fifth of December 5c prepared their muffin stall. Their goal was to raise enough money to make a difference in countries like Mozambique where people don't have access to clean water and resources that you or I take for granted. 5C would do this by donating all the money they raised to Oxfam.

Around two weeks ago 5c started the project by collecting data to see which muffins were the favourite of the school. This was done by students going around to classes and asking teachers if they could survey some students. And, after only two sessions all the surveying was finished and the end result was put into a graph on Excel and it was clear, Vanilla and Chocolate chip were clear winners and Berry came third only slightly beating Banana.

Next, the students of 5C had to advertise their muffin fundraiser. Groups worked very hard on assembly speeches, made announcements, posters and even sent out compass reminders. But there was still one thing left to do-go down to Foodworks and purchase their ingredients. And, after two long sessions of maths, hard work and pushing trollies up a hill they had done exactly that. The decision was to only purchase dry ingredients like flour and sugar, the ingredients which wouldn't need to be refrigerated, and were therefore easier to transport.

Ingredients were being sorted into 20 packs to be taken home by some eager bakers on Friday. But on Monday, disaster struck. Two whole batches of muffins had been left at home and one batch wasn't even cooked at all and lots of people had forgotten to bring money but not even once did anyone think of giving up. The muffin fundraiser continued from Monday and all the way into Tuesday and ended up selling over \$450 dollars' worth of muffins and I am proud to announce all of that money is going to Oxfam to help families in poverty. A big thankyou to anyone who bought a muffin and donated to such a worthy cause.



FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors, excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works and sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF will be provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- · \$125 for primary school students
- \$225 for secondary school students.
